

# Historian Report

Significant November Dates in Military History


- \* On Nov. 10, 1775, Congress directed the raising of two marine battalions under Capt. Samuel Nicholas, marking the birthday of the U.S. Marine Corps.
- \* A crowd of 15,000 gathered on Nov. 19, 1863, for the dedication of the National Soldiers' Cemetery at Gettysburg, Pa. President Abraham Lincoln gave a "little speech," which he thought was a failure because of the audience's lack of reaction. It became known as the Gettysburg Address and is now recognized at one of the greatest speeches in our country's history.
- \* On Nov. 24, 1902, the U.S. Navy commissioned the Bainbridge, which has come to be recognized at the first naval destroyer and carries the designation, Destroyer No. 1.
- \* CPL. James B. Gresham and PVTs. Thomas F. Enright and Merle D. Hay became the first Americans to be killed in WW I during a nighttime trench battle at Bathelmont, France.
- \* On Nov. 24, 1944, 111 land-based B-29 aircraft from the 73<sup>rd</sup> Bombardment Wing bombed the Japanese capital of Tokyo.
- \* On Nov. 1, 1945, PFC Desmond T. Doss became the first conscientious objector to earn the Medal of Honor for his actions as a member of a medical detachment to help save the lives of wounded soldiers on Okinawa.
- \* The U.S. Air Force's first supersonic bomber, the B-58, made its maiden flights on Nov. 11, 1956. The aircraft became operational in 1960 and remained in service until 1970.
- \* The first major engagement between regular forces of the U.S. and North Vietnam took place on Nov. 14, 1965. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Brigade, 1<sup>st</sup> Cavalry fought a three-day battle with three North Vietnamese regiments in the Ia Drang Valley.
- \* On Nov. 18, 2002, United Nation inspectors returned to Iraq after a four-year absence to resume the search for weapons of mass destruction.
- \* An American guided missile frigate, the USS Vandergrift, sailed into Ho Chi Minh City on Nov. 19, 2003, flying the U.S. and Vietnamese flags. It was the first U.S. warship to dock in the country since the Vietnam War.
- \* Insurgents set off at least two car bombs and attacked a police station in the central Iraqi town of Samarra on Nov. 6, 2004, killing at least 29 people and wounding 40. Over 50 people were killed across central Iraq including two dozen Americans.



Let's talk, yet again, about Veteran Scamming. I was under the belief that once your monthly benefits are set up and you are receiving them routinely, your concerns about scammers would vanish. Well, forget that myth. You still have to be vigilant. Scammers have found a new option, payment redirection.

Payment redirection occurs when a bad actor obtains a Veteran's Personal Identifiable Information (PII) and uses the information to unlawfully access and gain control of personal information (email or bank accounts, <u>va.gov</u>, etc.). Once the information is compromised, the scammer redirects the victim's VA benefits payments to accounts or prepaid debit cards the scammer controls. Veterans' personal information is vulnerable to phishing attempts and an array

Bad actors are leveraging publicly available information from internet sources, social media, dark web, etc., to gather PII:

With enough demographic information, they can call the National Contact Center and change Veterans' bank accounts to redirect their payments.

With stolen passwords and credentials, they can access Veterans' information through VA.gov.

So what sorts of things can you do to protect yourself? See the following:

Be alert! Identity theft is not always committed by strangers

Frequently change and maintain strong passwords and never use PII in the password Verify your identity—obtain a VA Security PIN to secure direct deposit accounts from theft and protect PII

Be cautious of companies claiming to contact you on behalf of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) or presenting itself as having an affiliation with VA

Contact VA immediately at 1-800-827-1000 if you find a payment discrepancy or suspicious activity within your direct deposit account

#### **Burial Allowance**

As a reminder to our membership, once a veteran has passed, another important aspect of our government's "Allowed Benefits" comes into play for which the veterans family must apply. These benefits (burial and plot costs) are offered to help cover some burial costs. The Veterans Family/NOK (Next of Kin) must apply for these allowances. Use the link for description and steps to request benefits up to 2 years after death of your veteran.

The items for verification which the family/NOK must provide are: DD-214 and Death Certificate.

Receipts of expenditures paid.

Statement of Account (preferably with the letterhead of the funeral director or cemetery owner)

It is imperative that you, the VFW/AL veteran, provide this information to someone in your family to apply for these benefits. Our government has a 2 year limit, **from date of death**, for these allowances to be paid to the deceased veterans family/estate.

If the veteran is to be buried at Abe Lincoln National Cemetery, or any other national cemetery, review their requirements at:
