





# Historian Report

On Sept.9, 1776, the Continental Congress formally renamed the United Colonies the United States.

A U.S. naval force commanded by Commodore Oliver Perry defeated the British in the Battle of Lake Erie on Sept. 10, 1813 during the War of 1812. Perry's report of the battle read, "We have met the enemy and they are ours."

On Sept. 13, 1847, during the Mexican War, U.S. Marines raised the American flag over the Mexican fortress of Chapultepec that guarded Mexico City. The victory is commemorated by the words, "From the Halls of Montezuma" in the opening of the Marine Hymn.

General Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson captured the Federal garrison at Harper's Ferry, Va., (now West Va.), on Sept. 15, 1862, opening the way for Confederate forces to advance into Maryland.

On Sept. 4, 1886, a U.S. Army detachment captured Apache leader Geronimo in Arizona. He was eventually imprisoned at Fort Sill, Okla., where he died in 1908.

Tanks were first used in warfare on Sept. 12, 1918, when the 304 Tank Brigade under the command of Gen. George S. Patton, Jr., attacked German forces at St. Mihiel, France, in WW I.

U.S. intelligence broke Japan's super-secret Purple code on Sept. 25, 1940. Along with breaking Germany's Enigma code, it was a prime intelligence accomplishment in WW II.

The first engagement on German soil during WW II took place on Sept. 12, 1944, as the 1<sup>st</sup> Army advanced into enemy territory north of the city of Trier at a central portion of the Siegfried Line.

On Sept. 4, 1950, during the Korean War what is considered the first helicopter rescue of a pilot behind enemy lines took place.

USS Enterprise (CVAN 65), the world's first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier was launched on Sept. 24, 1960 at Newport News, Va.

The last major military operation in which U.S. ground troops participated during the Vietnam War began on Sept. 5, 1970, with Operation "Jefferson Glen." It would continue in Thua Thien Province until Oct. 8.
