



Usually in this section, I highlight VA benefit information or VA health care news I think would be of interest to all of you. I'm going to step away from that this month.

Since we are about to observe Memorial Day this month, I wanted to share a personal Memorial Day experience. This happened about six or seven years ago. A friend of mine had an old 1946 Chevy pickup and he decided to drive it in the Memorial Day parade. He asked if I would care to ride along, I reluctantly agreed. We got down to Jackson and got in line. The folks there asked me my name and made a sign that said "SGT Dennis Lukavsky." They mounted it on the side of the truck along with a sign for my friend. As we slowly made our way along the parade route something happened I will never, ever forget. I became very, very emotional, and it became impossible for me to hold back the tears. To put it simply, I cried like a baby. It was caused by the outpouring of gratitude, the shouts of "thank you" and "thank you for your service," and of course the cheering of the parade viewers. Clearly, I did not know most of these people but here they were, cheering me along as if they had known me

their whole lives. As we turned down Benton, the cause of my tears dawned on me. This was the first time in 50 some years the public ever said "THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE" to me. It touched my heart deeply and was one of the best experiences of my life. Besides honoring the fallen, Memorial Day also helps lift up those of us who remember our collective experience while serving.

If you have not participated in the parade in the past this would be a great time to start. You never know, you may find some long lost feeling surfacing in you that you have missed.

Significant Dates in History

- On May 10, 1775, the Green Mountain Boys, led by Col. Ethan Allen, captured the British fort at Ticonderoga, N.Y. Col. Benedict Arnold assisted Allen.
- Benjamin Stoddard was appointed by President John Adams as the nation's first Secretary of the Navy on May 18, 1778. Within months Stoddard drafted legislation for the organization of the U.S. Marine Corps.
- Poet Edgar Allen Poe enlisted in the Army on May 26, 1822 and was discharged in 1829 with the rank of Sergeant Major. In 1830, Poe was appointed to West Point but was later dismissed for deliberately breaking regulations.
- On May 13, 1846, Congress declared war on Mexico at the request of President James Polk. The war ended with the Treaty of Guadalupe-Hidalgo in 1848.
- ◆ The longest battle of the Civil War began on May 21, 1863, with the Union siege of Port Hudson, La. Fighting continued until July 8.
- On May 7, 1915, a surprise German submarine attack sunk the British passenger ship, Lusitania, with the loss of 128 American lives. The action led to the loss of U.S. neutrality during WW I.
- Germany unconditionally surrendered on May 7, 1945, at General Eisenhower's headquarters at Rheims, France, with all military actions on European fronts ending at midnight on the following day.
- On May 10, 1959, the USS Triton (SSN 586) was commissioned at Groton, Conn. It was the first submarine equipped with twin nuclear reactors.
- ◆ The USSR show down a U.S. reconnaissance plane and captured the U-2's pilot, Francis Gary Powers on May 1, 1960. Powers was freed in a prisoner exchange for Soviet KGB Col. Rudolf Abel on Feb. 10, 1962.
- On May 10, 1972, U.S. Navy pilot Lt. Randall Cunningham and his Radar Intercept Officer Lt (jg) William Driscoll became the first American aces of the Vietnam War. Flying an F-4 Phantom from USS Constellation they shot down three MIG 17's.
- On May 12, 1975, Cambodian Communist gunboats seized the U.S. freighter Mayaguez in the Gulf of Siam and taking its 39 crewmembers captive. President Gerald Ford sent U.S. air, naval and marine forces to free the ship and crew on May 14 with the action resulting in 15 Marines killed and 50 wounded, mostly due to an accidental explosion during the attack.
- On May 26, 2004, U.S. troops captured a key lieutenant of radical Shiite leader Mugtada al-Sadr during a nighttime action in Najaf, Iraq, that killed 24 people and wounded 50.

Honoring our Fallen Veterans

Yes, we will again be placing Flags on our Veterans Gravesites prior to Memorial Day in Honor of their Service to our Country. We will start this on **Thursday, May 25th**. On that day we go to all our smaller cemeteries in the Naperville area and to our various Memorials. We will only need 5-6 helpers. If you can assist, please plan to meet at the VFW by 8:30am and we will proceed first to Big Woods and then to the rest.

On **Friday, May 26th,** please plan to be at St. Peter and Paul Cemetery no later than 9am so we can render honors to those Veterans interred at that Cemetery. Then on **Saturday, May 27th,** please plan to be at Naperville Cemetery by 9am so we can proceed with the flag placement there. We will do this rain or shine and can always use help. We currently have approximately 3,000 gravesites to place a flag. Thanks to Jim Hoch, all our Veteran Gravesites have been identified and are compiled by Cemetery Section's, so they are easy to use and to locate.

Then on Tuesday, May 30th, starting no later than 9am, we will be picking up all the flags starting at St. Peter and Paul and then to Naperville Cemetery.
