








#### AMERICAN LEGION RIDERS CHAPTER 43

a small thing that we do, but it seems to bring joy to the Veterans. I do know that these events surely bring joy to us Riders, and gives us a chance to saddle up and get outside and ride in the wind. We also had the honor of attending a parade for a young man who had just finished 1-1/2 years of cancer treatments. Thank you to the Riders who made us aware of this event.

Especially memorable was a ride on 1 August, where many of us rode to honor and raise funds for the Chris Patterson Memorial Foundation. Chris was a graduate of West Aurora High School. He then attended Valparaiso University where he joined ROTC. He also joined the Indiana Nation Guard, where he served as a Combat Engineer (12B). In 2011 his Guard unit was deployed to Kandahar Province in Afghanistan, but since he was involved in ROTC, he was allowed to stay in college to finish his education. He insisted on deploying with his unit, and on 6 January 2012 he was killed by an IED. Many of us rode in his North Aurora funeral in 2012, and continue to ride in his memory every year. On a happier note the Riders have also participated on many "Operation Welcome You Home" events.

The Riders have just announced that they are donating \$7,000.00 to the Legacy Fund. This fund offers college scholarships to the children of service members who have been over 50% disabled or killed since 9/11. With a 10% matching grant from Post 43, the total donation is \$7,700.00. Thank you all who have supported our charities in the past. We are sorry to announce that, due to Covid-19, we have had to cancel the Riders Annual Fundraising Dinner previously scheduled for 3 October 2020. We are still looking for ways to raise funds so that we can continue to support so many Veteran related charities. Last year we donated over \$12,000.00 to various Veteran charities such as DuPage Veterans Foundation, Naperville Responds, Legacy Fund, Assisted Living Homes, and other Veteran needs. ## America Reaches a Tipping Point, from a Chaplain's Perspective

God Bless You Veterans, Family and Friends of Post 43! Stay healthy and try to stay positive and active during these challenging times! Remember, God will never

leave your side, and yes he remains in control over the continuing events happening in our country and the world at large. We are truly experiencing, and for most, living through historical days as events continue to unfold in our country; with the pandemic now six months in duration. In this space, I wish to take a step back and reflect on what the unfolding events of 2020 may be trying to tell us, and how to make sense of the year you and I have been a witness to.

America has reached a turning point with respect to our national economic, political and cultural landscape. A common point of agreement was recently identified by John Rappaport, Dr. David Jeremiah, John Hagee, Dr. Robert Jeffers, Franklin Graham, Dr. Charles Stanley, and Jonathan Cahn, author of the bestseller "The Harbinger." #### September: Mix of Momentous and Monstrous

This month marks both the official birth of our country's name and – at the other end of the spectrum – the vicious attacks on the World Trade Center, the Pentagon and the crash of United Flight 93 in Shanksville, Pa.

On Sept. 7, 1776, the Continental Congress adopted the name, United States, in place of United Colonies.

American forces captured Major John Andre on Sept. 23, 1780, foiling his plot with Benedict Arnold to turn over West Point to the British. Andre was hanged a little over a week later, but Arnold escaped and received a commission as a brigadier general from Britain, as well as a lifelong pension for his wife.

During the War of 1812, the U.S. brig Enterprise defeated the British brig Boxer. During the fierce battle, both ships' commanders were killed. Enterprise's skipper, Lt. William Burrows, was the son of the Commandant of the Marine Corps.

The Stars and Stripes were raised for the first time over a foreign capital when the flag flew over Mexico City on Sept. 14, 1842.

General Thomas J. "Stonewall" Jackson captured Harper's Ferry, Va., from Union forces on Sept. 15, 1862.

On Sept. 12, 1918, the largest concentration of aircraft during WWI took part in the opening of the St. Mihiel campaign. Col. Billy Mitchell commanded 1,462 aircraft and some 30,000 U.S., British, French, and Italian personnel.

President Woodrow Wilson signed the "Pershing Bill" on Sept. 3, 1918, creating the permanent rank of General and making John J. Pershing the ranking Army General Officer for as long as he remained on active duty.

Army pilot Maj. Frederick Martin, with mechanic Sgt. Alva L. Harvey, complete the first flight around the world on Sept. 28, 1924, after 365 flying hours, covering more than 29,500 miles.

U.S. 1<sup>st</sup> Army tanks and infantry marked the first engagement on German soil during WWII on Sept. 12, 1944, north of Trier in central part of the country.

On Sept 2, 1945, the Japanese formally surrendered on the deck of the U.S. battleship Missouri, in Tokyo Bay, ending WWII.

The Department of the Air Force was established on Sept. 18, 1947, as a separate service, transferring air activities from the Army.

On Sept 15, 1950, U.S. Marine, Navy and Army forces, as well as Korean troops, landed at Inchon, South Korea, reversing the Communist North Korean invasion and leading to securing the city of Seoul by the end of the month.

Captain Charles DeBellevue became the leading Air Force ace of the Vietnam War on Sept. 9, 1972. As flight systems Officer, in an F-4 Phantom, he assisted in shooting down the fifth and sixth MiGs in his tour.

On Sept. 7, 1994, the U.S. Army closed its headquarters in Berlin, ending this country's military presence in the post-WWII once divided city, nearly a half century after the end of the conflict.

U.S. troops invaded Haiti on Sept. 19, 1994, in an effort to restore democracy in that country.

Sept. 11, 2001: no description needed, as we remember.


