

This is the time of year when our thoughts turn towards the approaching holidays and the plans most of us will be making with friends and family. Likewise we should also be thinking of ways we can help those less fortunate and how we might be a blessing to

them thru the giving of our time, talents and finances! Let me suggest several activities that we all can take time to participate in, that others will truly appreciate your caring and compassion. Every Saturday morning from 10-11am members of Post 43 and the VFW attend a morning coffee at one of Naperville or Lisle's Senior Living facilities. (See schedule on page 9). Ken Mores took over for Lee Lindberg, who originally started the idea for these visits, and does a fine job in overseeing and leading this event. In attendance at these coffees are Veterans who served in the Gulf Wars, Vietnam, Korea and World War II. Their tales and real life stories about their time of service, particularly in war time, is captivating to listen too. Some have given recounts of being POW's, while others fought it out in the Pacific, Philippines, or in the unforgiving climate of Vietnam. This is better than reading their exploits of heroism in a history book because each of these brave Veterans are themselves a living talking "history book!" I can promise you that you will come away from one of these coffees a changed person with a renewed appreciation for the sacrifices these men and women made in the defense of freedom for our nation. They also have humorous anecdotes about military service that will leave you smiling. Do yourselves a favor and plan on attending at least one of these coffees every month.

Now for the other activity which is also a blessing to others. On Tuesday, December 10<sup>th</sup> (bus leaves at 6:15 pm) join us when we travel to Hines VA Hospital in Maywood to sing Christmas carols and pass out presents to our wounded Vets, who are recovering from emotional and physical trauma. Some of these Vets have nobody visiting them, except us, and they are so grateful when we take time to show we care. Again Veterans and family members of the American Legion and VFW are transported to and from Hines Hosp. by bus for an evening of holiday cheer. For many of us it is an emotional experience to see the tears in the eyes of a Veteran, as each sings his service song and chooses their favorite holiday carol. For many their patriotism is rekindled, which is moving to each of us, and each Vet gets a present or two plus a Christmas card and custom made blanket. In the 10 years I have attended this event, I have been emotionally moved visiting these Vets, as you soon will be. Plan on bringing and sharing your joyous holiday spirit with a Vet who would most appreciate you caring to visit them at holiday time. You will never forget this experience!!

Finally, in his book "30 Life Principles" Pastor Charles Stanley reflects on 50 years of personal ministry with the truths and principles he has followed to enjoy life at its best. Stanley says "life does not have to be boring or a constant struggle". Instead it can be a dynamic, fulfilling, and exciting adventure through the application of these principles which serve to guide, comfort and instruct us:

- Our intimacy with God-His highest priority for our lives-determines the impact our life will have.
- Obey God and leave all the consequences to Him.
- God's word is an immovable anchor in the storms of life.
- The awareness of God's presence energizes us for our work.
- God does not require us to understand His will, just obey it even if it seems unreasonable.
- You reap what you sow, more than you sow and later than you sow.
- The dark moments of our life will last only as long as is necessary for God to accomplish His purpose in us.
- Fight all your battles on your knees and you win every time.
- Trusting God means looking beyond what we see to what God sees.
- If necessary, God will move heaven and earth to show us His will.







