Historian Report

Significant dates in military history

Lt, John Paul Jones unfurled a flag for the first time aboard an American man-of-war on Dec. 3, 1775.

On Dec. 23, 1783, General George Washington resigned his commission to retire to his Mount Vernon home, saying "I here offer my commission and take my leave of all employment of public life." Despite this declaration, Washington went on to serve as U.S. President from 1789 to 1797.

The regular, daily ration of whisky to soldiers ended on Dec. 8, 1830, because of the liquor's "pernicious effect upon their health, morals and discipline."

Congress authorized the Medal of Honor on Dec. 21, 1861. The medal initially applied only to Navy and Marine Corps members with an Army version following a year later.

The last major battle between U.S. troops and Native Americans occurred on Dec. 29, 1890, at Wounded Knee, S.D.

On Dec. 5, 1929, Marine Reserve Capt. Alton U. Parker became the first pilot to fly over the Antarctic continent as a member of Admiral Richard Byrd's South Pole expedition.

On Dec. 7, 1941, the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor – a "day that will live in infamy." The attack destroyed 19 U.S. ships and 188 planes. More than 2,400 personnel were killed or wounded.

The U.S. declared war on Japan the following day with Germany and Italy declaring war on this country on Dec. 11.

Major Glenn Miller, director of the Army Air Forces band and previously, as a civilian, was one of the country's leading band leaders, disappeared on Dec. 15, 1944, during a flight from England to Paris.

The last Civil War veteran, Walter Williams, died at the age of 117 on Dec. 19, 1959.

On Dec. 11, 1961, the first direct military support of South Vietnam took place with the arrival of two Army helicopter companies assigned to ferry the Asian country's troops in combat.

Gerardo Hernandez, the leader of a Cuban spy ring, received a life sentence in a Miami federal court on Dec. 12, 2001, for his role in infiltrating U.S. military bases and the deaths of four Cuban-Americans.







Naperville "Vietnam Wall of Remembrance"

On November 9th through November 13^{th,} we had our own "Vietnam Wall of Remembrance" on display in our Naperville Park District Grand Pavilion area. All items, including the "Wall" printing (Blooming Color); installation (NRFV) and take down; building supplies (84 Lumber); etc., all donated by local businesses and individuals. Also, we had 130+ Veterans doing 4 hours shifts from 6am-10pm daily to assist the public in answering questions; help find names on the "Wall"; and sharing their personal stories from serving in Vietnam. I want to personally thank each of them for coming and sharing their experiences and to help others find a "Name on the Wall". We made a lot of people happy to experience that.

In addition, we had special 13 plaques on display to highlight the 11 Men from Naperville that died in Vietnam and all those men and women that died due to their service in Vietnam. We estimated our attendance between 1500 and 2000 based on the number of Programs given out. These were beautifully designed and printed by our American Legion Department Print Shop.

Finally, the purpose of having this "Vietnam Wall of Remembrance" here, is that 2023 represents the 50th anniversary of our departure from Vietnam. It is not necessarily a celebration, but a "Remembrance" for all that Served their Country, especially those that Paid the Ultimate Sacrifice.

It has truly been a very honorable experience being part of this and again-

with the VA, If that is your interest, in addition to a DD 214, also bring any personal records to support your claim (ie. personal medical records). If there is related information in you military records the VA will retrieve them as part of the claim search.


We are very lucky to have a VSO coming to us each month. Come and visit us and get your questions answered the first Tuesday of the month.
