COMMANDER'S CALL

Greetings Fellow Legionaries:

As you read this, we are in the last month of the first quarter already. Can't believe the year is going by so fast! Your American Legion continues to work for you and for all Veterans. The second six priorities for 2020 are below. I continue to be impressed with how far the American Legion is able to make our yearly dues of \$40 go!

Veteran Homelessness: VA pledged to eradicate Veteran homelessness and The American Legion supports the continued funding of programs to address this serious issue. Congress must continue making investments in affordable housing, and programs that help get Veterans and their families off the streets and into stable housing with supportive services.



VA Benefits: Many military retirees are forced to forfeit a portion of their pension in order to receive VA service-connected disability pay. VA survivor benefits are also offset from military Survivor Benefit Plan annuities. The American Legion supports legislation to repeal both of these unjust offsets.

GI Bill: Expanding GI Bill benefits to include access to capital for entrepreneurial Veterans enables them to overcome a major obstacle in building a small business. The American Legion supports legislation that would expand GI Bill benefits to assist Veterans in obtaining access to small business capital.

Veteran Employment Rights: The American Legion will continue to urge Congress to prohibit employers from pressuring service members into waiving their employment rights and protections through arbitration agreements.

National Security: The American Legion supports a defense budget that reverses sequestration and its effects, rebuilds U.S. military end strength and weaponry and fairly compensates military personnel, especially in an ongoing time of global warfare.

Implement, Oversee New Laws: The 115th Congress was filled with significant wins for America's veterans. Now, these wins must be implemented. The American Legion will continue to support the oversight over the implementation of critical legislation passed during the 115th Congress, securing that these laws are enacted correctly and in the best interests of America's veterans.

You can see that our membership dues are not wasted. They are used at all levels of The American Legion. Next Month, I'll research and share the Department of Illinois American Legion Priorities.

As of right now our membership stands at 530 of 573 or 92%. This is fantastic progress, but we are 43 members shy of meeting our numbers from last year! Sadly we lose Legionnaires each year that pass away, and those that move out of state and transfer to another post. Though we will never replace their memory, we must sustain their legacy by recruiting new members to fill our ranks.



On to some good news, WE ARE MODERNIZING! We recently set | Jennifer Slown up a PayPal account, so that Post 43 can accept credit cards for

membership dues and renewals. We have not yet integrated this function into the naperlegion.org website, but expect to see an announcement soon once that function is up and running. The goal of this change is to streamline our membership process and cut down on wait times for checks being received and membership cards being mailed. Current members can renew on the National website, but new members who join on the National page are not associated with our Post automatically, meaning we miss welcoming new members!

We are also reintroducing the "5 for 4" dues program. When you pay for four years up front (\$160) you get your fifth year free! If you already paid your 2020 dues, you will have to wait until July 1st to take advantage of this. That brings up another good point, you may not know that The American Legion runs on fiscal year, not the calendar year. The fiscal year starts July 1 and ends June 30th. That means if a new member joins in May 2020, their 2021 dues will be due starting July 1st, NOT January 1st. If you're in a mid-year pay cycle, i.e. you joined between Aug-May and traditionally pay your dues at that time, consider marking your calendar to renew in July. This helps us keep an accurate accounting of our membership.

Lastly, the grand prize of a \$100 gift card to Hugo's Frog Bar and Fish House is still at stake! The member that recruits the most Legion members to our Post between September 1st, 2019 and May 31st, 2020 will win! To ensure you are credited for those you recruit, simply notify Adjutant Rios, so we have an accurate accounting! Thanks for being a valued member of Post 43!

2020 AMERICAN LEGION POST 43 SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

<u>Purpose</u>

American Legion Post 43, Naperville, in order to assist a deserving young man or woman pursue their education after high school, will award a graduate (up to two) of the class of 2020 from an accredited Illinois high school a scholarship of **\$5000.00**, to paid directly to any technical school or degree granting college or university within the United States, upon confirmation of enrollment.

Eligibility

- Resident of Illinois who is currently a senior in high school in the class of 2020 and
- Child, stepchild or grandchild or great grandchild of a member of Naperville American Legion Post 43, Chapter 43 Legion Riders, or Sons of the Legion Squadron 43
- Or currently a member of Boy Scout Troop 106, or The Ghostriders Sea Cadet VF-142 Squadron, or was a High School Oratorical Contest participant or attended Illinois Boys/Girls State under the sponsorship of Naperville American Legion Post 43
- Or the child of a Naperville military veteran who, while a resident and on active duty, was killed or suffered a disability of 50% or more as determined by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs

Selection Criteria

- Academic achievement (GPA: high school transcript required)
- Leadership and participation in school and/or community activities
- Honors,
- Community Service
- Patriotic Involvement
- Student essay describing the responsibilities of citizenship in a democratic society. The essay shall be the original work of the student. Any other material must be footnoted. The essay shall not be longer than three typed pages, and will be formatted with one-inch margins, 1.5 line spacing and 12-point font.
- The grading of this essay will be based on grammar, spelling, originality, context and content at a level consistent with exceptional high school work. The essay may count up to 30% in selecting the winner.

Applying for the Award

Send all required material and supporting documentation to American Legion Post #43, P.O. Box 4, Naperville, IL 60566, Attention: Scholarship Committee. Please include your name, address, phone number & email address for contact information. Applications must be received by **March 25, 2020.**

The decision of the Scholarship Committee Judges is final and all applicants will receive written notification that a decision has been reached. The winner will be notified by telephone and presentation of this award will take place on the evening of April 18, 2020 at the American Legion Awards and Recognition Banquet.

Anyone may nominate a candidate by sending a letter or email that includes a comprehensive description of the services the nominee performed, the time frame, duration, and significance of the service to others, and the category they are being nominated for, along with the name and contact information for the nominee and the person offering the nomination. Letters from others endorsing the nominee are encouraged.

Naperville is blessed with people who serve their fellow citizens. Typically, the judges have a very difficult task. Comprehensive information-attachments and endorsements may be included-are of great help to them in selecting the winners. They may be mailed to American Legion Post 43, Citizen of the Year, Post Office Box 4, Naperville, 60566 or emailed to vahlej@comcast.net to arrive by **March 18, 2020.**

Winners will be announced in the local media and honored at the Legion's Awards and Recognition Banquet on April 18, 2020. So, fire up your keyboard; sharpen your pencil; and make sure the selection committee knows about your candidate.
