
National Vietnam War "Veterans Day", Wednesday March 29th, 2023

Some of you may have noticed that I have been adding general VA news and VA Health articles in the email blasts I send out. It's not a coincidence, I thought it would be important to collect as much "VA News" as possible. I know there is a lot of information (probably too much for anyone) in many of these releases. I don't read everything either. But I do think it is worth your time to scan over the blasts and look for articles that apply to you. There is always a chance you are missing out on some benefit you are entitled to have. My philosophy is that my job is put out as much information as I can. Your job is to decide what is important to you.

I want to quickly mention Scammers/Phishing over the Pact ACT. There has been a major increase in scammer activity due to the Pact ACT. From my point of view you should only talk to an accredited Service Officer about filing a claim. Scam's are becoming more and more sophisticated thus more difficult to identify. Significant Dates in History

- The Boston Massacre took place on March 5, 1770, after protests in front of the Boston Custom House over several issues including posting British soldiers in the city. Five people were killed and five were wounded in the incident that fueled anti-British feeling that ultimately led to the Revolutionary War.
- On March 16, 1802, Congress authorized the establishment of the U.S. Military Academy at West Point.
- ◆ The Alamo fell to Mexican forces on March 6, 1836, with all defenders including Davy Crockett killed with the exception of a mother, child and servant.
- The first battle between ironclad ships was fought on March 9, 1862, between the Union Monitor and the Confederate Merrimac (later named Virginia) at Hampton Roads, Va.
- On March 15, 1916, General John J. Pershing led an expedition across the Mexican border in pursuit of Pancho Villa whose forces had earlier attacked Columbus, N.M., killing 18 Americans.
- The American Legion was formed on March 15, 1919, at an organizational meeting held at Cirque de Paris at the behest of Theodore Roosevelt with the purpose of seeing to the welfare of American WWI veterans. Congress formally incorporated the Legion the following September.
- ◆ The first large-scale aerial attack on Berlin by U.S. forces in WWII took place on March 6, 1944. Some 600 heavy bombers dropped 1,600 tons of explosives on the German city.
- U.N. forces recaptured Seoul, Korea, on March 14, 1951, the fourth time the South Korean capital changed hands since the start of the Korean War.
- ◆ The first commitment of American ground troops in South Vietnam occurred on March 8, 1965, when 3,500 Marines from the 3rd Marine Division based in Okinawa landed to provide securing for the Da Nang airbase.
- On March 10, 1983, the Coast Guard retired the last operational HU-16E Albatross, ending the era of seaplanes for the service.
- ♦ The military invasion of Iraq began on March 20, 2003 led by U.S. Army General Tommy Franks under the codename Operation Iraqi Liberation (later renamed Operation Iraqi Freedom). The 248,000 U.S. soldiers and 45,000 British troops were joined by soldiers or equipment from some 40 other governments.

WILL YOU NOMINATE NAPERVILLE'S CITIZEN OF THE YEAR?

Naperville American Legion Post 43 began naming a Citizen of the Year in 1986. Because of COVID-19, we did not have a Citizen of the Year for 2021, but we will be awarding a single Citizen of the Year award for 2023.

We are again asking for community assistance to identify deserving candidates, and we especially would like input from our own American Legion and VFW members.

Nominee's service must be in support of the Naperville area or its bordering communities. Members of the American Legion, Sons of the Legion, VFW, and Auxiliary are eligible, but it is not limited to. The service must have been performed in a volunteer capacity, rather than as part of compensated employment.

Anyone may nominate a candidate by sending a letter or email that includes a comprehensive description of the services the nominee performed, the time frame, duration, and significance of the service to others, and the category they are being nominated for, along with the name and contact information for the nominee and the person offering the nomination. Letters from others endorsing the nominee are encouraged.

Naperville is blessed with people who serve their fellow citizens. Typically, the judges have a very difficult task. Comprehensive information, attachments, and endorsements may be included, and are of great help to the committee in selecting the winner. Nomination may be mailed to The American Legion Post 43, Citizen of the Year, Post Office Box 4, Naperville, 60566 or emailed to r.yndestad@yahoo.com to arrive no later than March 31, 2023.

The winner will be announced in the local media and honored at The American Legion's Awards and Recognition Banquet on April 15, 2023. So, fire up your keyboard; sharpen your pencil; and make sure the selection committee knows about your candidate.
